
The assembly is a musical composition especially arranged for school work, and can be used by the pianist, band or orchestra, or reproduced by mechanical instruments or talking machine records.

To assemble the classes, dismiss them, send them to drill, recess, etc.

The following explanation is in reality a summary of directions for the demonstrator, or the teacher, to instruct boys and girls.

Before the music begins the teacher announces to the class that they will prepare for assembly, recess, drill or dismissal, as the case may be. The class immediately stops work, putting books away in the desk and await the music.


U.S. Bugle Call "Assembly" is first given forth.



Immediately the words "ONE! TWO! THREE!" are given orally.

As the pupils hear "ONE!" they Turn, "TWO!" Rise, "THREE!" Face.

Then the word "ATTENTION" and the U.S.Bugle Call is played.



And immediately after "sound off" is given by the drums, to which rhythm the boys and girls mark time and are ready to march at the beginning of the Music, starting with the left foot on the first beat.

NOTE: The march is well accented. It has a special School flavor in both melody and rhythm, is written in excellent march time and does not fail to hold the attention of the boys and girls.


