A Bitter Feeling.—The Shanghai Central News gives in today's dispatches a gloomy view of affairs at Wei-Hai-Wei, the fortified city on the Shantung promontory. There is little doubt that the Japanese intend to attack this Chinese stronghold shortly, despite the tradition of the Chinese that the place is impregnable. The lights along the promontory have been extinguished, the buoys have been removed, and the Chinese are constantly adding to the defences by laying torpedoes and submarine mines. Nevertheless, on three successive nights in the last week Japanese torpedo boats have entered the harbor and reconnoitered the forts. The crews of the Chinese torpedo boats, which lie in the harbor, had no inkling of the nearness of the enemy until the Japanese
